Challenge



While overall graduation rates are on the rise in Florida, under-resourced students continue to fall behind their peers. These children are at risk of dropping out, making them more likely to be unemployed, commit crimes and become a societal burden for taxpayers.

Solution



Through the Super Kids Club and Super Teens Club, New Horizons has demonstrated success in improving the graduation rate among under-resourced youth in SWFL. These programs provide after school tutoring and mentoring along with daily lessons and encouragement needed to succeed in school and life.

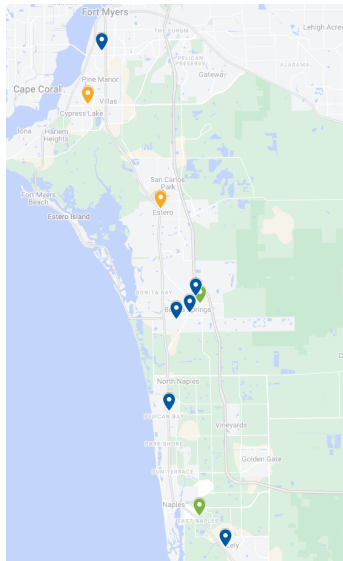

Programs

- Super Kids Club**
K-5th grade after-school programming takes place on Monday through Thursday during the school year.
- Super Teens Club**
6th-12th grade after-school programming takes place on Monday through Thursday during the school year.
- Super Kids & Teens Clubs**
- Super Boys & Girls Clubs**
The Friday afternoon club prepares 4th & 5th grade boys and girls for middle school.
- College Bound**
After school on Friday, 11th & 12th graders receive personalized help applying and preparing for college and vo-tech programs.
- Super Kids Reading Camp**
A four-week summer camp that is tailored to reinforce the reading skills of K-5 students
- Super Teens Leadership Camp**
A four-week summer camp that aims to enhance the leadership skills of 6th-12th grade students
